BIBLICAL COMMUNICATION

- 1. Focus is to glorify God
- 2. Desire is to be conformed to the image of Christ through conflict
- 3. Disciplined: Speaks with the gentleness of Christ in spite of tension
- 4. Listens: Gathers information to better serve the other person
- 5. Works diligently to build intimacy with God and others
- 6. Implements Godly Power (Phil. 2:1-8)
 - Humility
 - Servanthood
 - Making self nothing
 - Obedience to God
- 7. Begins with acknowledging one's own faults
- 8. Speaks the truth in love
- Emphasis is on understanding the deeper motives of the heart
- 10. Engages in prayer before confronting
- 11. Seeks biblical reconciliation (Confession, Repentance, Forgiveness, Luke 17:3-10)

Unbiblical Communication

- 1. Focus is to glorify self
- 2. Attempts to conform others to one's personal desires through fighting
- 3. Impulsive emotionalism: Engages in yelling and inappropriate expressions of emotion in the midst of tension.
- 4. Listens: Simply waiting for ones turn to speak.
- 5. Works relentlessly to win arguments
- 6. Implements sinful power (Gal. 5:19-21)
 - Manipulation
 - Hateful speech
 - Self-seeking
 - Anger/intimidation
- 7. Begins with finding the faults of others
- 8. Hides the truth to avoid confrontation
- 9. Emphasis is on cosmetic techniques
- 10. Engages others before praying
- Seeks to appease rather than reconcile (saying, "I'm sorry" simply to end the conflict).
