Dani Treweek says that "as we find ourselves immersed in all the debates and discussions, we often forget that we are not ultimately talking about issues. Or matters. Or agendas. On each and every 'side' of each and every debate are people. Real-life, breathing, hurting, loving, laughing, crying, human people. Surely Christians – those who are called to love others as themselves – should be the first to recognise this vital truth. Yet so often, we sharpen our theological debating expertise while forgetting the importance of practicing love."

- b. Derogatory language or stereo-typing attitudes towards anyone would not be tolerated either up-front or in conversation between church family members.
- c. All in your church know that we all experience sexual brokenness and all are being encouraged to confess their own sexual sins.
- d. Same-sex sexual relationships are never mentioned in isolation from other sinful patterns of behavior, or from the forgiveness offered to all through faith in Christ crucified.

Kathy Keller says that "people with SSA may be the ones that God chooses to lead and purify his church for the next revival. Because their faithfulness both as an example and as an indictment to those of us who have made our peace with less visible and less controversial sin patterns is going to be the thing that the culture cannot deny. The truth of Christianity is visible in the lives of people who have chosen to be celibate. It is so counter-cultural and it will attract questions and people will be won to Christ through that.²⁴
